### THE WHITE DRAGON ANCIENT EMBLEM OF THE ENGLISH

The Anglo-Saxon migration to Britain began in the 5th century AD. The most famed of the early migrants were Hengest and Horsa who arrived with their warriors in three ships. In the following years many warriors and settlers crossed the sea and settled lowland Britain from East to West. They came from the Engle (English), the Seax (Saxons) and the Jutes. From the Jutes came the people of Kent and the people of the Isle of Wight and the mainland opposite Wight. From the Saxons came the East Saxons (Essex) and the South Saxons (Sussex) and the West Saxons (Wessex). From Angeln came the East Engle (East Anglia), Middle Engle (English Midlands), Mercians (Mercia), and all the Northumbrians (North of the Humber), which included those now known as the Lowland Scots.



## Unity

The Engles (English) were the dominant group and by the 9th century the settlers had merged into one English identity. The English gave their name to the land they lived in (Englond) and the language they spoke (Englisc), which has evolved into modern English. Those writing at the time also referred to the English as the Angles or Anglo-Saxons. The settlers were closely related peoples – so similar in appearance and culture that they were able to merge into one English identity. Later they absorbed closely related Danish and other Scandinavian settlers.

## The White Dragon

Both the English and the Welsh adopted the Dragon as their battle flag. The Dragon of the Britons can still be seen in the Red Dragon of the Welsh while for the English it was the White Dragon that was to prove most enduring. The Dragon was flown when King Alfred the Great defeated the great Viking Army at the Battle of Edington and it was the banner carried by the mighty King Athelstan when he smashed the combined armies of the Scots, Welsh, Norse and Irish at the Battle of Brananburgh in 937. The Dragon was flown by Harold II, when he destroyed the Norse army at the Battle of Stamford Bridge in 1066 and it was the banner under which he and his warriors fought to the death, three weeks later defending their homeland.



## Modern Times

In the following centuries the flag of St George was adopted as the flag of England, which it still is. However, in modern times, when our country is seeing much change and turmoil, the White Dragon flag is being revived as the flag of the English. It is a symbol of our identity, our common history and of the kinship of all the Anglo-Saxon people. It is also a stark reminder that in multi-cultural England unless we embrace these things then we will surely die.

In displaying the flag we assert and celebrate our communal identity and ancient roots. The White Dragon is the flag of the English community – the ethnic English – the descendants of those who lived in England 1000 years ago.

#### TIW'S SYMBOL

**This is the runic symbol for Tiw.**

He is possibly the oldest of all the gods worshipped by the early English. From the god Tiw we get the day Tuesday (Tiw's Day) as well as many place names scattered across England. He was the god of war and was worshipped and evoked during times of battle. Tiw lost his right hand through an act of bravery and thus his symbol was said to evoke honour and courage. He was the protector of all warriors, but was also said to watch over the disabled, and the left-handed. His runic symbol was stamped onto swords and other weapons to give them strength and to guide their users hand.



#### THUNOR'S SYMBOL

**The Vikings called him Thor.**

To the English he was Thunor – the powerful God of Thunder. His symbol represents his battle hammer Mjolnir, with which he fought and defeated the giants. The strike of the hammer caused thunderclaps, and indeed, the name of this deity has produced the word for thunder in English and other northern European languages. Thunor was the God of the common man and often sided with mortals against other Gods. He is remembered by us in the fourth day of the week Thursday (Thunor's Day) as well as in many place names across England. Thunor was one of the most venerated of all the English Gods and his hammer was worn as a symbol of protection, strength and courage. It is often found in the graves of our early heathen ancestors.



The late summer of 1066 and the English army is camped on the south coast awaiting the coming invasion from across the channel.
